## THE ORGANIZATION

The Food Literacy Project is the nonprofit education partner to a vegetable farm in



Louisville, KY whose mission is **inspiring a new generation to build healthy relationships with food, farming and the land**. Founded in 2006, the Food Literacy Project offers farm based <u>education programs</u>, professional development for educators, family programs, and entrepreneurial youth development programming. Program participants (typically K-12, with occasional pre-K and adult groups) visit our working vegetable farm to learn about fresh healthy food and the soil where it grows while using all their senses to explore the farm. While all Food Literacy Project programs bring the Field-to-Fork experience to life for our participants, our teaching staff and volunteers customize each program to meet the learning needs of the diverse groups we serve.

#### RESPONSIBILITIES

Farm-Based Educators (FBEs) deliver direct service on Oxmoor Farm and at local schools and community centers, planning and leading hands-on education activities with youth and adults. FBEs also maintain our program areas, and lead <u>volunteer projects</u>. The majority of work is done outdoors and can be physically demanding (walking, lifting, kneeling, crouching, etc.) FBEs also help with office tasks associated with managing a small nonprofit, including mailings, running errands,



printing of newsletters and other publications, managing program supplies and other tasks as needed.

# Qualifications

• Bachelor's degree preferred, or equivalent experience.

• Experience teaching or <u>working with</u> <u>children</u> or the desire to learn.

• Experience with diverse populations, especially at-risk youth, is beneficial.

• Must pass criminal background check.

• Be physically able to participate in and lead farm and garden work projects, and to work outdoors in all weather conditions.
